# SCCC MEETING 13 MARCH 2024

## **Dunoon to Gourock Ferry**

It was agreed SCCC would try to get some agreement from the other local community councils to seek support for the plan proposed by Neil Kay.

### **Mid Term Elections**

The discussion on this was inconclusive so it remained to be seen what vacancies would be filled.

#### 10% Council Tax Increase

There were mixed views on this, ranging from strong opposition to an understanding of why the council felt they had to push through this increase. A number of inefficiencies were identified. Councillors present also had differing views on this, understandably.

### **AOCB**

- Kyle thanked the council for the work that has started on the high road in Innellan to resurface the road.
- The Lido: Ian updated SCCC on the meeting held in December. Shop use still needs to
  increase to take the pressure off financially. Staff rotas are being reviewed again. Work
  continues to improve matters and the committee are making the efforts required. Some
  specific issues were discussed, eg lottery/scratch cards and ferry tickets.
- Wall at top of war memorial gardens is in a dangerous condition.
